- November 9, 9:10–9:50 AM and 12–1 PM, online, free

Two free digital programs will explore various World War I locations that are significant to British Columbians. ## **Dunkirk**

- November 10, 11, 12, 7:15 PM, IMAX® Victoria
- Christopher Nolan's *Dunkirk* recounts the mass evacuation of Allied soldiers from Belgium, the British Commonwealth and France during one of the fiercest battles in World War II.
   The film opens as hundreds of thousands of British and Allied troops are surrounded by enemy forces, trapped on the beach with their backs to the sea they face an impossible situation as the enemy closes in. Tickets available through box office and at imaxvictoria.com.

### **Remembrance Day Recital**

- November 11, 12–12:45 PM, onsite, Carillon Tower
- A live concert of wartime music will be played from atop of the Netherlands Centennial
  Carillon on the museum precinct by provincial carillonneur Rosemary Laing following the
  conclusion of the ceremony at the cenotaph at the BC Legislature Building around 12 PM.
  The critically acclaimed <u>Victoria Children's Choir</u> will also perform a special Remembrance
  Day concert in Clifford Carl Hall on the ground floor of the Royal BC Museum from 12:30–
  12:50 PM. It's free to attend and registration is not required.
